## **Lindiwe Dovey**



Originally from South Africa, Dr Lindiwe Dovey is Senior Lecturer in African Film and Chair of the Centre for Film Studies at SOAS, University of London. She is also the co-founder and former director and curator of two of the UK's major African film festivals - Film Africa in London (www.filmafrica.org.uk) and the Cambridge African Film Festival (www.cambridgeafricanfilmfestival.org.uk). She has published widely on cinema, African film, and film festivals, and her most recent book - Curating Africa in the Age of Film Festivals (Palgrave Macmillan, 2015) - draws together her work experiences and research of the past fifteen years. Cameron Bailey, the Artistic Director of the Toronto International Film Festival, has described it as an "essential read". Lindiwe also writes about film and festivals for a broader public (for example, The Guardian), and has been invited to be on festival juries and panels in different parts of Africa and Europe. She received her BA Honors from Harvard University in Film Production and Theory (VES) and her PhD from the University of Cambridge. She has been the recipient of numerous prizes, for example, a Philip Leverhulme Prize and a Choice Award for outstanding scholarship, and the SOAS Director's Teaching Prize.
